BASIC SUMMARY:

The Research Technician will be responsible for preparing and monitoring animals during surgical/interventional procedures. These duties will be performed in compliance with applicable Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), Good Laboratory Practices (GLP, Association for Assessment and Accreditation of laboratory Animal Care (AAALAC), United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), and Food and Drug Administration (FDA) standards and regulations.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Performs anesthesia induction and maintenance for surgical procedures.
- · Prepares laboratory animals for surgical procedures.
- Monitors and collects data from laboratory animals including physiological observations, anesthesia level, Activated Clotting Time (ACT) and blood gases,
- Administers a variety of medications as prescribed by protocol, surgeon/interventionalist, study director/principal investigator and/or veterinarian.
- Performs and/or assists in non-sterile and sterile study specific surgical procedures.
- Interfaces with Surpass clients.
- Operates and performs occasional maintenance and/or calibration on surgical support equipment (e.g. Hemochron).
- Maintains a safe and healthy work environment that complies with all safety policies and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards.

Skilled in anesthetic induction and support preferable.
